LITERACY AND NUMERACY STANDARDS - RESULTS

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The exam results for the literacy and numeracy standards are now available online via the NZQA portal. Your child can log in using their credentials to view their results.

These are the new NCEA standards called Common Assessment Activities or co-requisites. Under the new NCEA structure, all students need to pass the reading, writing and numeracy exams to attain NCEA.

If your child did not pass, they can download a brief report detailing their performance. We understand how important these results are, and we encourage you to support and motivate your child as they prepare for the next opportunity to take the exams in September.

We wish two of our former students the very best of luck at the upcoming Paralympic Games in Paris.

| Cameron Leslie - no stranger to the Paralympic | Games, he is the world record holder and three time | Paralympic gold medalist in the Men's Individual Medley | 150m SM4.

Cameron is back to compete in his fourth Paralympic Games, and has the honour of being one of the two official flagbearers at the Games.

Neelam O'Neill - this is Neelam's first Paralympic Games.

She earned selection in the R3 mixed 10m Air Rifle Prone SH1 and the P2 Women's 10m Air Pistol SH1. In doing so, she becomes the first female kiwi Shooting Para sport exponent for 40 years to compete at a Paralympic Games. She is also the first woman to represent her country in air pistol at the Paralympics.

We will be cheering them both on from our seats at home and wish them every success!
