Kia ora koutou katoa,

"Let's just get started and doesn't need to be perfect from Day 1". These were the words from the Minister of Education, Erica Stanford, as the opening keynote speaker at the Association of Integrate Schools conference that I attended in Wellington earlier this week.

She was discussing the need to take urgent action to address the 'crisis' we have in our education system. While I might not have agreed with her assertion that our current education is in a crisis, I did agree that, sometimes, you just need to make a good start and then do the tweaks and adjustments as you develop an initiative or programme of learning.

The good start that we are making is addressing the recurring theme of our parent surveys – communication! Having already introduced SchoolBridge in a previous college, this is one way that we are going to be addressing and improving our communication with our community – for parents, students and staff. It comes as both a desktop app and a mobile app, so, for parents, from the convenience of your phone, you can send in absences, check the school calendar, get the daily notices and soon, receive and respond to permission slips for EOTC trips and camps. We are looking to release this shortly and will be sending further information about how to download the app and start communicating.

This is a beginning for our improved communications and, as communication is a two-way process, please let us know if you can see opportunities to strengthen our communications within this community. With SchoolBridge, there is a lot more potential in this software that we will continue to develop as we progress and hopefully, get to a place where "Dialogue [or, in our case, communication], in fact, educates when the person relates with respect, esteem and sincere listening, and is expressed with authenticity without obscuring or softening one's own identity, nourished by evangelical inspiration." The library will be open for students to study each day.

The morning time slot is officially two hours; however, students may continue into interval.

Year 11 students will have normal classes for periods 3, 4 and 5 during the first four days of EDGExams. All Year 11 classes will run on Wednesday, 18 September. Year 11 students are expected to be in school uniform.

Year 12 and 13 students will not have any classes running during EDGExams. Year 12 and 13 students are expected to wear appropriate, comfortable clothes.

All OLC exams will run on Tuesday, 10 September. This timetable will be emailed to OLC students.

Official Corequisites (session 2) will run Wednesday, 18 September (Literacy: Reading); Thursday, 19 September (Numeracy); and Friday, 20 September (Literacy: Writing)

All corequisites will start Period Three at the Hall.

*Scheduled exams takes precedence over 12/13ART and 12/13ARD times.

If your school bus is running late when you have a morning EDGExam, please do not panic – just come to the Hall as soon as your bus arrives.

INFORMATION FOR EDGExams:-

Students need to report to the exam venue **fifteen minutes before the exam** is due to start. They will not be allowed into the exam if they are **more than 30 minutes late**.

If they are doing a digital exam, they must provide their own computer. With all exams, they are expected to bring their own equipment such as calculator, ruler or coloured pencils.

Appropriate, comfortable non-uniform clothes should be worn by the Year 12 and 13 students who are on study leave. Students may be asked to clear out pockets of clothing with large pouches or pockets.

Year 12 and 13 students will not have any classes running for the duration of exams, however, the Year 11 students timetable will vary due to the new Level 1 NCEA structure. The library will be open for students to study each day.



ATTENDANCE DUES FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Information regarding Attendance Dues:

- Attendance Dues are the compulsory component of the school account, and they are charged to every child who attends a Catholic School in New Zealand.
- Payment is a condition of enrolment that parents agree to when they enrol their children at a Catholic school.
- Without this charge, the Auckland Diocese would not be able to provide new buildings, build new schools, repay the loans incurred for recent new builds, or pay insurance and compliance costs on integrated buildings.

Financial assistance is available to assist families who may need financial support with the payment of Attendance Dues, for preference students attending both primary and secondary Catholic schools in the Auckland Diocese.
