It is with pleasure that I write my first newsletter to the Pompallier Catholic College community. I was welcomed to Pompallier Catholic College at a warm and lively pōwhiri last Tuesday, 15 October. I include below an excerpt from my speech on the day:

"It is those here in uniform, sitting before us today, who are the 'why' of Pompallier Catholic College. I acknowledge you this morning, students of Pompallier. I look forward to being your principal. I thank you for your welcome. This is your school, your place of learning and your community. One day ago, most of you did not know me. Now I am your principal!

A Catholic College in the Marist tradition, according to Jean Claude Colin, has 3 key aims:

- 1. The formation of Christians
- 2. The formations of good living people
- 3. The formation of scholars

Yours is the noble task of enacting the vision and values of the college. I acknowledge you this morning. In particular, I acknowledge that this is your place of work and your community. It is because of your dedication to Pompallier Catholic College that it is a wonderful school, where students achieve academically and where the great potential of the young men and women before us this morning is nurtured, and where they are prepared for the adventure of the world that awaits them when they leave the gates of their school for the final time.

This is your work; I thank you in advance for continuing in this work, and I look forward to working with you as we continue the Pompallier journey together."

I would like to thank all those involved in the organisation of the pōwhiri, including the Board of Trustees, Fr Brian Prendeville, Taipari Munro, Fred Tito, all invited guests, Chris Allen (Acting Principal Terms 2-3), the Senior Leadership Team, staff and students of Pompallier Catholic College. Your welcome has been generous. I am now enjoying the mahi that has begun.

STUDENT ABSENCES

New process for advising us of student absences:

SchoolBridge is the new way to notify us that your child is going to be absent, or arriving late to school.

There are 2 options available:

- Click the "Report an Absence" button on the main page of our school website: <u>https://www.pompallier.school.nz/</u>
- On the SchoolBridge app, click the "Report Absence" button.

Please note that we will no longer accept absences via the phone or email.

If you need to take your child out of school early for an appointment, please ensure that they bring a note to school and take it to the Student Centre in the morning, so this can be recorded. If you have an unplanned appointment that they need to leave for during the day, please phone and speak directly to the Student Centre on 438 3950, Option 2.

BUS PASSES ...

If your child loses their pass, they can apply for a replacement by paying \$6.50 to the college office.



A temporary pass will be issued, and a new pass will be ordered for them. As these are printed off-site, they can take up to a week to arrive.



STUDYLINK 2025

Apply before 16 December you can't miss it.

If you're studying in 2025, 16 December is a very important date. It's one you just can't miss.

Around 120,000 students will need to get organised for study in 2025. Apply for your student allowance or loan before 16 December to give yourself the best chance of having everything sorted and ready for the start of your course.

If you've had a student allowance or loan in the last 12 months, login to MyStudyLink and use the Returning Application to apply. It'll take less than five minutes.

A MESSAGE FROM KIWIRAIL ...

Over the past 20 months, KiwiRail have been working hard to remediate the North Auckland Line (NAL) from Whangārei to Auckland. This line has reopened and in the upcoming weeks you may notice an increase of freight trains travelling through this section as we help settle the tracks in.

We remind students, friends, and whānau that it is illegal and extremely unsafe to enter into the rail corridor and to only ever cross the tracks at an official level crossing and never walk on, or across the tracks at any other point. Always expect trains and rail vehicles, they can come at any time of the day or night, and from either direction.

Tracks are for trains. Help us keep everyone safe and remember to only ever cross the railway tracks at an official level crossing and obey all signs and signals.

SCHOOL LOCKERS

You will need to return your key at the end of the term, sellotaped to a piece of paper with your details on for your bond refund. Ensure the locker is left empty, as any remaining items will be disposed of at the end of the year.

Safe speeds around schools Ngā tere haumaru tata ki ngā kura

New variable speed limit coming to your school from 29 October

To help keep young New Zealanders safe, NZ Transport Agency (NZTA) is setting a new variable speed limit that targets the times when vulnerable tamariki are most active around this school.



What this means

Following formal consultation with the public, the Director of Land Transport has approved a variable speed limit of 30km/h on State Highway 14 past Maunu School and Pompallier College.

We've installed electronic variable speed limits signs outside your school to display the lower variable speed limit during peak school travel periods.

When will the variable speed limit operate, and how will people know it's operating?

The variable speed limit will be active from 8 to 9.30 am and 2.30 to 4pm on school days to help slow traffic down when people are travelling to and from school.

When operating, the variable speed limit of 30km/h will appear on a flashing electronic sign. When the sign is not operating, the sign will be blank and the permanent speed limit of 60km/h applies.

Variable speed limits are legally enforceable.

Helping students understand the importance of safe speed limits

If you're a parent, caregiver or teacher wanting to help students understand why safe speeds are important around schools, there are several resources available in the NZTA Education Portal (education.nzta.govt.nz).

These include ideas for fun and interactive lessons you can do with tamariki in the classroom, in the courtyard, or at home.
