Ash Wednesday and the Beginning of Lent

Once a year, on a Wednesday, approximately one billion Catholics receive the symbol of a cross, drawn in ash, on their foreheads. The meaning of this earthy and visible symbol of Christianity is, of course, related to the beginning of Lent. At Pompallier Catholic College this week, we followed this centuries-old tradition with Ash Wednesday Liturgies, led by college Chaplain Fr Brian Prendeville. The season of Lent, which traces its origins back to the early days of the Church, is a period of 6 weeks of preparation for Easter. It is a season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (giving to those in need).

Here at Pompallier, Lent is an opportunity for our students to remember that we have limited time here on earth to seek after our creator, to love and serve others, and to make our lives count. And, more importantly, Lent gives our whole community an opportunity to recall again the cornerstone and the reason for our existence as a school: the events of Holy Week and Easter 2000 years ago. Jesus's betrayal, crucifixion and resurrection, and the ultimate hope that this represents, seem as relevant as ever in a world that is facing serious, existential issues in 2025.

As Lent begins, we pray for the courage, faith and leadership required for us to hold out hope and strength to those around us. I am encouraged by the good young men and women at Pompallier Catholic College, and see them as young leaders amongst their peers, holding out this hope to those around them.

May God's blessing and guidance be with you all during this Lenten season.



VALUE

Four-year scholarship programme (valued at \$28,000) managed by First Foundation to provide talented young New Zealanders opportunities and resources to help them successfully navigate from school, through university and into a meaningful career.

Our life-changing 4 year programme offers:

- A personal mentor* for 4 years (Year 13/1st . Year University to 3rd Year University)
- Exposure to Work ** (4-5 weeks per year)
- Access to wrap around support from First Foundation's Student Support Team
- Access to Workshops and Events***
- \$14,000 towards tertiary fees/costs**** at degree level (\$2,000 at the end of the final year of school, \$4,000 per year for the second, third and fourth year of university)

*All efforts will be made to successfully match scholars to a personal mentor in their recruitment region by the Orientation and Induction in January - February. There may be delays if scholars are recruited outside of our main regions (Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch) OR if a scholar moves away from their recruitment region.

**Not all scholarships naturally come with work experience opportunities. Where they don't we will make every effort to work with you to create those opportunities.

***Workshops will primarily be delivered online, larger events will be delivered in our main regions (Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch)

****The scholarship provider determines how the scholarship funds can be used. The scholarship funds are primarily for tertiary fees. However, some scholarship partners do allow scholarship funds to be allocated for some university costs such as, textbooks, coursework resources, transport, accommodation, and IT resources. Please note, this is not guaranteed for all scholarships.

ELIGIBILITY

First Foundation scholarship applicants must meet ALL of the following criteria:


- Household income threshold guidelines
- Income cap \$75,000 1-2 dependents*
- o Income cap \$90,000 for 3 or more dependents* Currently be enrolled at Year 12 at a NZ Secondary School
- Endorsed Merit or Excellence at Level one NCEA or equivalent. **
- Be a New Zealand Citizen, NZ Resident, or Refugee Status

*Dependents are your parents/caregivers children who are financially dependent on their income. We do have some grey areas here.

** Where a school does not offer qualifications at level 1 we will use schools recommendation or equivalence in the first instance.

PRIORITIES

- Year 12
- First in Family to attend University
- Scholars meeting the household income threshold
- Endorsed merit or excellent at level one (or equivalent) .
- Intergenerational change
