As we near the end of Term 1, the essentials of daily school life have been on my mind. A settled school environment enhances learning, and a thriving Catholic Character provides the foundation upon which a settled Catholic school is based.

There are key ingredients that contribute to this daily goal of learning based upon our Marist Catholic Character:

Faith in action: Our Catholic Character should be visible each day. Student leaders are role models of faith, prayer is a daily ritual, and service to others should be evident.

Attendance: We want our students at school, every day. Time away from the classroom should be limited to school activities or illness only.

Respect: A standard of respect is required at Pompallier Catholic College. This creates a safe culture where students are held accountable for words or actions that harm the community. This culture of respect enhances the learning environment.

Uniform: Wearing our uniform correctly is a symbol of belonging and pride.

A current snapshot of the college indicates that the majority of our young men and women score highly for all four of the above measures. Of the four, the uniform could improve the most. For this reason, it will be a focus for Term 2. A recent email from me (repeated on the following page) pointed out particular work-ons.

We can be proud of Pompallier Catholic College students. They are warm, outward-looking, and they are likewise proud of their school. We can also lift our sights and envisage their growth, nurturing and inspiring them to fulfill their potential.

The heart of the Gospel message is a constant call to growth, a striving to reflect Jesus' great commandment to love God and neighbour. As we pause next week to recall the events of Easter, may we receive the grace and courage to renew our commitment to this Gospel, the whakapapa of our faith community.

St Francis Xavier Parish & Pompallier Catholic College Statement

Two Catholic Priests with links to Pompallier Catholic College and St Francis Xavier Parish Whangārei are currently before the courts in relation to the sexual abuse of minors. Father Rowan Donoghue is accused of offending at St. Bede's College in Christchurch between 1996 and 2000. He was at St Francis Xavier Parish in 2002 and was Pompallier Catholic College Chaplain in 2002. Father Michael O'Donnell has pleaded guilty to offending at Hato Pāora College in Feilding from 1986-1990. He was at Pompallier Catholic College from 1992-1994 and St Francis Xavier Parish in 2010.

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Please **see below for a link** to our uniform requirements at Pompallier Catholic College. While most students are wearing their uniform correctly, there is room for improvement in a few areas. In particular, students have been reminded:

- All shoes are to be monotone black (see attached for full details)
- Boys are to be clean-shaven
- Hair is to be tidy and of natural colour
- Girls' skirts are to be knee length
- Non-regulation items are not allowed

It is understood that items requiring either alterations or new purchases may take a few weeks. For this reason, students have until the beginning of Term 2 to ensure items such as footwear and skirt lengths are remedied.


SHAKESPEARE FESTIVAL WINNERS !!
